## **Project Description:**

Lack of potable water has serious effects on students' academic performance and attendance rates. The absence of safe water can cause even the best students to suffer a loss of momentum as they deal with stomach pains and diarrhea from disease and hunger. In Ghana, many girls are given no choice but to skip school during their time of the month. In some cases, girls simply don't have access to sanitary products; in others, they face discrimination and stigma during their periods; in others still, they don't have educational resources to inform them about safe, sanitary hygiene practices. These issues only scratch the surface of problems schools without clean water and sanitation areas face.

By developing a sustainable Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Infrastructure system at OLA Girls High School, 1138 students and 125 teaching and non-teaching staff in Kenyasi 2, Brong Ahafo, Ghana. Between July 2019 and July 2020 IDEAS For US - Ghana will be partnering with Ghana Education Service, Asutifi North District Assembly, GADeF and GrassRoots Hub.

#### **Project Goal:**

This project aims to strengthen the capacity of the WASH facility for the sustainable WASH infrastructure at schools, ensuring students have access to clean safe drinking water. Additionally WASH stations allow for improved hygiene, teen-friendly services, better greywater management, and alternative sources of water (i.e. rainwater).

## Measurable Objectives:

- Increased awareness and access to WASH infrastructure facilities for schools in the establishment of innovative WASH facilities
- Increased capacity of school children, teachers, and local leaders to manage and sustain WASH facilities in OLA Girls Senior High School (SHS)
- Innovate Personal Hygiene management (PHM) attained in OLA Girls SHS
- Raise awareness around menstrual hygiene and gender promotion
- Reduced risks of bed bugs infections and diseases like Diarrhea, Dysentery, Typhoid fever, Cholera, and Hepatitis, etc.
